Must Have

1	You've watched all 3 (or 5) movies selected by your teacher.
2	You chose one movie.
3	You re-watched the movie you chose and selected a scene.
4	You re-watched the scene.
5	You adopted a formal, academic register.
6	You carefully selected relevant illustrations.
7	You clearly labelled and appropriately referenced to acknowledge the illustrations' source. (labels does not count for the word count)
8	You justified the creative choices in order to convey meaning in the completed film.
9	You clearly state which film elements they are going to discuss in the beginning of your textual analysis.
10	Your textual analysis contains the word count .
11	Your textual analysis lists all sources used for the film. (excluded from the word count)
12	Your project report's visual evidences have very brief captions , no comments.
13	Your textual analysis is typed in A4 page size .
14	Your textual analysis is typed using sans-serif font size 12 .
15	You acknowledged the source as an in-text citation if the content belong to another person.
16	You wrote more than one draft of your textual analysis.
17	You turned in your latest draft to your teacher with a week before the deadline.
18	Your paper is no longer than 1,750 words maximum.
19	You demonstrate an effective and highly appropriate understanding of the identified cultural context of the chosen film.
20	You support your understanding of the cultural context with references to highly appropriate and relevant sources that add to the critical perspectives explored in the work.
21	You evaluate the ways in which the extract uses the identified film elements to convey meaning .
22	Your textual analysis is not a detailed description of the scene chosen.
23	Your textual analysis is detailed, accurate and relevant.
24	You demonstrate an effective and highly appropriate understanding of how the cultural context and a selection of the identified film elements in the extract relate to each other .
25	You demonstrate an effective and highly appropriate understanding of how the cultural context and a selection of the identified film elements in the extract relate to the chosen film text as a whole.
